Our voice auction, full of amazing things, is on Saturday night, and we are having a reception (in the fan[zine] lounge in Hall 4) on Thursday for Kat and Sarah, together with Joro Penchev (this year's European Fan Fund winner). We hope to see as many former fan fund winners, and as many of all of you readers as possible, at those items. We hope to take a 'family photo' of all the GUFF delegates who are at the convention – there are a lot! – at that reception if possible.

After Worldcon Kat's spending time in Buxton and Yorkshire before travelling to Rotterdam for Erasmuscon, the 2024 Eurocon, and to Poland to meet fans there.

We will do some sort of financial note later in the year, but GUFF is in reasonable shape. We've had a lot of amazing donations this year, including a bunch of historical roleplaying material that we're intending to eBay (get in touch if you want to know when this gets sold), and we have had substantial cash donations from **Conversation**, the 2023 Eastercon and from **SCI-FI Inc** (bounty for Simon's trip report).
